TRANSACTIONS 2019-20**

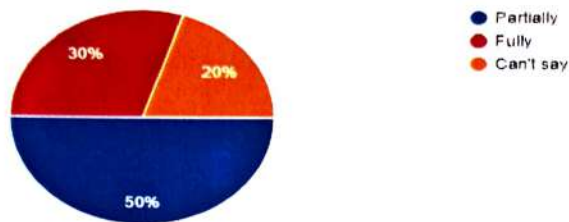
Consolidated Report
