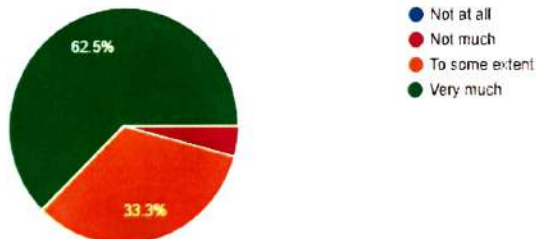
**ANALYSIS OF FACULTY FEEDBACK ON CBCS CURRICULUM OF GOA

24 responses

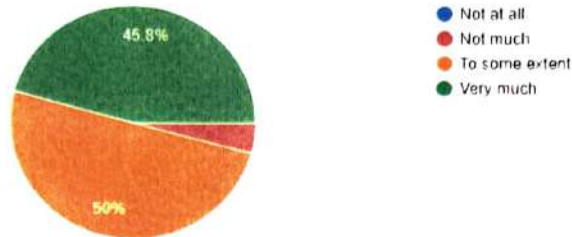

2) Does the curriculum give scope to the students to develop his/her inherent skills, personality and creativity?

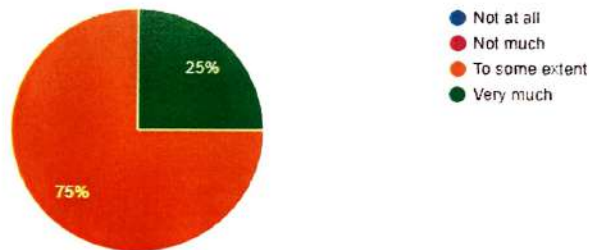

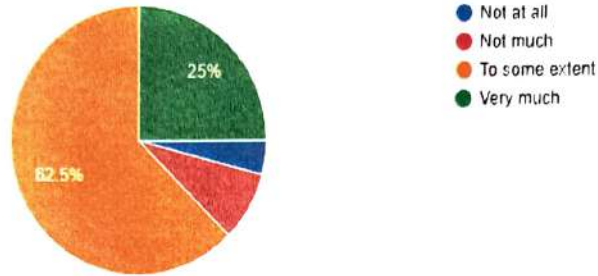

4) Does the curriculum enable the student to use computing skills and information technology in the class?

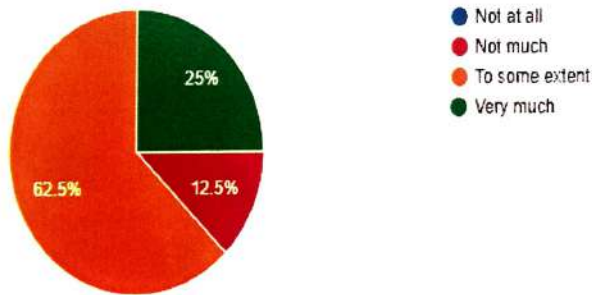

The above chart shows that 62.5% of the faculty is of the opinion that curriculum facilitates analytical and critical thinking among the students only to some extent.

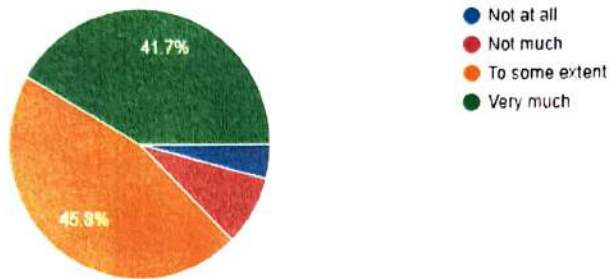

6) Does the curriculum facilitate acquisition of effective writing and speaking skills in the student community?

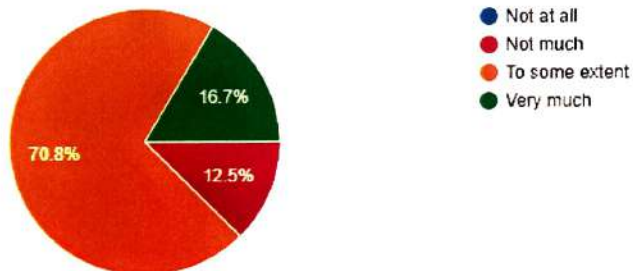

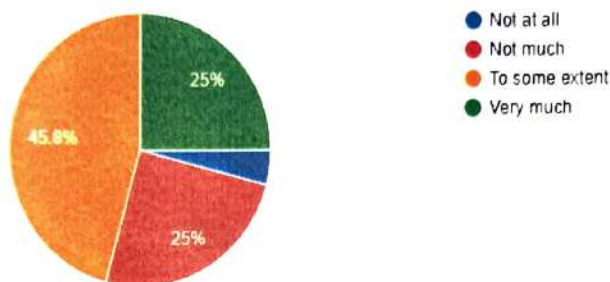
The above chart depicts that majority of the college faculty feel that the course study enables the students to acquire job related knowledge as well as employability skills only to some extent.

8) Does the curriculum help the student to learn on his/her own?

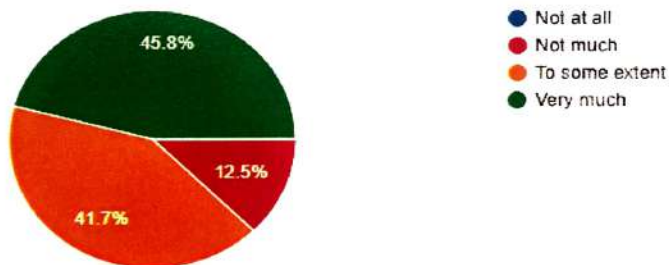

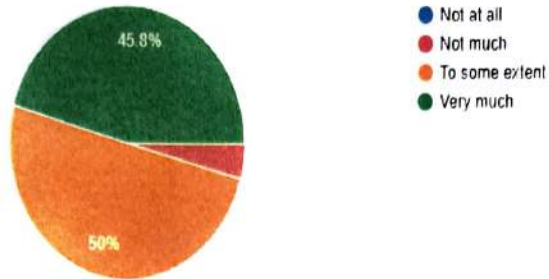
