

Most of the employers were satisfied with the performance of our students. However some of the employers were of the opinion that some more skill based courses could be included in the curriculum and gave the following suggestions:

- 1. Direct interaction between the students and the industry.
- 2. Commencing Master's programme.
- 3. Having more industrial visits, wherein the students can acquire more practical knowledge.
- 4. Career counseling and personality development.
- 5. Introducing practical aspects of management accounting and cost accounting.
